

What is Private Fostering?

- When a child under the age of 16 (under 18 if disabled) is cared for by someone who is not their parent or a 'close relative'.
- A private arrangement made between a parent and a carer, lasting for 28 days or more.

If a Private Fostering arrangement is made, there is a [legal obligation](#) on carers and parents to notify the local authority.

Who could be a Private Foster Carer?

- Extended family such as a cousin or great aunt.
- Friends of the family.
- Parents of a friend of the child.
- Someone previously unknown to the child's family who is willing to privately foster a child.
